Feedback Report

Introduction

In order to enhance quality education and maintain the standard of education the institution designed its own feedback system in 2013-14. Since then the knowledge about the impact of teaching and working of various departments and the infrastructure of the institution has been gained from the stakeholders physically in the questionnaire. This system has been improvised by the IQAC from time to time. But in order to get a crystal-clear feedback IQAC has been working for developing an online feedback system for two years which could be accomplished this year by the efforts of feedback committee. The new feedback system devised was in Google forms. These Google forms were floated in respective groups to get the feedback. These Google forms were to get:

1. The responses of students on infrastructure and facilities provided by the institution.
2. Students' feedback on teachers' performance.
3. Parents' feedback.
4. Teachers' feedback.
5. Alumni's feedback.
6. Feedback from the non-teaching staff.
7. Feedback from research scholars.

This practice has provided an opportunity to the stakeholders for expressing their opinions that are valuable for future development and results. The scores of the analysis were circulated among the staff so that they may improve themselves and enhance their abilities. Feedback analysis regarding infrastructure has been communicated to the Land and Building committee. The proposal of construction of a canteen with good amenities has been sent to them. The feedback on Library indicated some lacunas which were communicated to the Librarian. Library automation is under consideration. This information shall be used to make plans for the coming session.




Figure 1: Analysis of Students' Feedback Regarding Infrastructure




Figure 2: Feedback Analysis of Students on Teachers




Figure 2: Feedback Analysis of Students on Teachers (Q.12 & Q.13)




Figure 3: Feedback Analysis of the Institution by Research Scholars




Figure 4: Feedback Analysis of the Institution by Parents




Figure 5: Analysis of Feedback of Alumni




Figure 6: Analysis of Feedback of the Teaching Staff

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


Figure 7.1: Analysis of Feedback of the Non-Teaching Staff




Figure 7.2: Analysis of Feedback of the Non-Teaching Staff (Q. 14)
