2. It enables youth to access entry-level positions and placements.

3. The Context-There is a humongous gap between the skills existing in a person and the skills demanded by the industry and various companies. This excellent opportunity provides the students a competitive edge and better access to different career options thenceforth securing a better livelihood. It ensures a secure and stable future.
